Why is this important? On average...

4 firefighters are struck and killed each year

1 police officer is struck and killed each month

1 tow operator is struck and killed each week

at or near traffic incidents.

Description: The Strategic Highway Research Program (SHRP 2) developed a program, by responders – for responders, with the objective that nationally, responders acquire a common set of core competencies for traffic incident management. The safety of responders and motorists, quick response, and effective communications at traffic incident scenes are highlighted. Attendees will learn important safety principles and be reminded of important safety principles they may already know regarding the dangers emergency responders face every day.

Target audience: Fire, Police, EMS personnel and DOT/DPW, Towing and Traffic Management Professionals.
